Honoring Chris: The Trailblazer

Way back in 1993, Chris D. began partnering with Creative Support Alternatives for her Supported Living Services. When her Service Coordinator first introduced us to Chris, she was hospitalized and had been living in a group home for several years. Using her eye gaze to communicate, she let us know she wanted out and into a home of her own!

We quickly learned a lot about Chris: fiercely independent, opinionated, compassionate, loving daughter, and a pioneer of sorts. After six months of tireless work together, Chris moved into her first apartment. We'll never forget what she shared with us that first night in her new home, when she typed "It's just like Christmas". (In fact, we'd end up writing a story together about the experience and used that quote as the title for the story).

Over the next 10 years, Chris developed a wellearned reputation of Advocate, community college student, political activist, and founding member (along with Creative Support Alternatives) of the San Diego Homeownership Coalition. As such, she became the first person supported by CSA to purchase her own home. Using person-centered planning, Creative Support Alternatives was honored to support Chris to define her dreams...and go after them! As we approached that 10-year anniversary, we wanted to honor Chris. So in 2003,

the Pioneer Award was born and the first recipient was, of course, Chris. (The Pioneer Award continues to honor each person who reaches that very special 10-year anniversary of their own, as well).
